
Promotion of Sustainable Livelihood in Protected forest area






Seed Distribution in Quintal





Assets creations: through MNREGA, Govt. schemes

- ➤ With convergence with line departments and 58 farmers prepared open well under MNERAGA progarmme.
- 28 mini pond constructed in the project area
- 65 farmers get benefitted with farm banding progarmme under MNREGA.
- ➤ 37 farmers benefitted through support and guide to take irrigation equipment's under state government schemes.

Home visits: Discussion family issues, micro plan, plan for livelihood, education, Migration, assets building



SRI on Local Seed

- This was started in 2014-15 with one farmer
- This year 152 farmers involved in SRI
- Purely organic farming of SRI
- Good production in adverse conditions
- 10 variety of seeds surviving through the SRI




Over all Primary outcomes / Results

- Increasing additional family income through ginger, turmeric and potato cultivation as high value horticulture crops (Adopted by families and skills, competency and seriousness increases)
- Vegetables seed support added last year as per demand of beneficiaries.
- Through continue training, experts visit and regular feedback, farmers learnt about cultivation of ginger and turmeric, learned primary processing of turmeric also.
- Each family earned minimum Rs. 15 to 20 thousand by one crop annual (As per analysis of 10% families)
- Increasing of cultivation area of their fields in per year.
- There are 210 farmers who are taking at least two additional crop.
- Till last year there was no problem in marketing.

Seed Support: Ginger, Turmeric, Potato, Paddy & Other vegetable seeds

- > Till year 177 farmers added Ginger cultivation in their farming.
- Till year 212 farmers start Turmeric cultivation .
- Till year 164 farmers involved in Potato cultivation as in Rabi season crop.
- > Till year 152 farmers start Paddy cultivation with use to SRI method.
- Continuously 215 farmers growing various vegetables in every season and getting extra income for their livelihood.

Women: Cash availability, income flow increase, purchase capacity increase.

Family: Thinking about family members,
Nutritional availability through POSHAN BADI,
Purchase mosquito net, entertainment, Electric connection,

Changes on Livelihood Pattern: Decrease dependency on forest, Yearly there was little income through forest, after introducing these crops the community is not interested to harvest from forest because this is easy option and good returns, no risks of forest and park administration. Involvement of family on agricultural activities in increase, so the family do not have time to spent in forest.

Migration: Decrease in family migration, the family who is involved in new crop and vegetable cultivation they have fully stopped the migration.

Forest department: Mutual understanding between park and community for harvesting of things which is related to tribal customs, traditions. (Mahul leaves, Marriage ceremony, tubers etc.)

Changes among BAIGA Family

Collection to Production

Traditionally Baiga is not from cultivator community, They were good collector of forest produces, now they starts Production of vegetables, food grain

Assets creation

The community was not interested on creation of fixed assets, but now they also start thinking about assets which support their agriculture

Collective community Action

There is two different group which initiated collective efforts for irrigation facilities and agriculture.

Aware on Health

Level of awareness is being increasing, immunization, going for ANC, Institutional delivery

Poshan Badi

The community is also involve in Poshan Badi for consumption at the house

Reducing Migration

As per our data there was migration of the families for livelihood, in last two years they also not interested for migration

Food Security

Families now discussing and worried about food security and trying to focus on agriculture and vegetable cultivation, They have their traditional seeds which they want to conserve

Future Plan

"A" category families will be supported by only technical support

Work on livestock health and living conditions

Coordination and dialogue with Park Administration for local issues

Will add around 75
landless families and find
the possibility to work
with these families

Skill on Packaging and marketing of turmeric powder, ginger primary processing

Work on community health and service delivery

More assets creation through convergence with Govt. schemes

Involve families on vinegar making and marketing, from JAAMUN

Kisan Panchayat strengthening, develop vision plan for next 5 years

Marketing of dried vegetables, Use of solar drier

Seed bank of traditional seeds, Enough seeds will be available for at least 5 varieties.

Continue support to "B" category families and bring them in "A" category
