Key Note

This epidemic of Covid-19 affected the whole world, were the cities and villages all affected. Deaths in the world shook everyone, during this period, humanity also came out in the open and people became the support of each other. CDC as an institution Has done a lot of work in its field of work to suit its capabilities. During the lock down, our team reached far flung villages and distributed food, masks and sanitizers, as well as awareness work, especially our reach to children and women was much more. More than 2000 families were provided food from different sources.

This epidemic also affected our work, many programs and activities could not be executed during lock down. But the staff of all the projects participated in helping people and did whatever possible they could, during this time awareness was the most important to avoid the epidemic, to get the guidelines issued by the government from time to time The staff did a commendable job. The local administration also helped in the functioning of the institution.

The local administration provided every necessary permission so that we could reach the needy, the child line project team provided services not only in Balaghat but also in Seoni district. As conditions became normal, we resumed our work. In the changing circumstances, the way of working also changed, without any risk to anyone, with sufficient caution, carried out the activity with small group in the community. Organizing necessary support and training to farmers for their farming, pregnant and lactating women were made aware through small meetings on their health.

This year has been very challenging for the institution, on one hand there was an epidemic and on the other hand people had their own needs and requirements. We have also received a lot of support in this situation, mainly we are thankful to Paul Hamlyn Foundation, The Hunger Project, Wipro Foundation, Child Line India Foundation, Consortium for Street Children and Jagori Rural who provided various resources to us to help people.

Sustainable Livelihood

This was the last year of the livelihood project conducted in collaboration with the Paul Hamlyn Foundation, in this project we are working directly with about 350 farmers, the quality of the project is that more than 500 farmers indirectly benefited from this project. , Farmers strengthened their livelihoods by taking advantage of government schemes along with information on agricultural techniques and new crops. The benefits of MNREGA scheme were provided to the people, the target families created different types of resources for themselves, such as land reforms, ponds, irrigation wells etc. The Baiga tribe resides in Ghurasibhera, we are working with 20 families here, for these adequate arrangements for irrigation have been made through the project, benefits of the government scheme have been provided to them and solar pumps have been installed. , The Baiga community is doing better farming.

Activities in 2019-20

Capacity building is an important part under the project, the members of the target families who are involved in farming are trained on different subjects. Sufficient opportunities to teach the farmers learning were provided through the project, trained on vegetable production, compost manure, paddy production, turmeric, ginger and potato production through different subject matter experts. The specialty of this project is to enable families and increase their livelihood through agriculture and horticulture crops, the most important thing we came to know when most of the families were facing food problem in lock down, 90 percent of the project Families had enough food grains available, as well as families had savings. Most of the families associated with our project can easily face the crisis. No relief material was made available to these families from the CDC, the beneficiaries of the project asked other families to provide support and also collaborated on their own behalf. In the project, apart from livelihood, other topics are also constantly discussed, such as people are prepared for community cooperation and community development. Apart from helping and supporting each other, people also exchange information. Today, there are plenty of indirect beneficiaries along with the families directly connected to the project, which has increased the chances of impact of the project considerably.

Seed Bank for conservation of Indigenous Seed

An important work that we have done in the project is the conservation of traditional seeds of Gond and Baiga tribal communities. In three to four years, we worked to collect the seeds of the community's supernatural seeds such as maize, kodo, kutki and many types of vegetables, these are the species which are on the verge of extinction or almost extinct. There was a lot of discussion with the community and an action plan was made to save and grow the seeds that were going extinct, this was necessary because when we talk about the food security of the community, people would have a big role to play in this. Yes, it is important that farmers have their rights over these seeds. Separate clusters of the project village were formed by creating seed banks and their seeds are being collected in this, farmers are taking seeds from these seed banks and also returning them. There are about 5 to 7 types of paddy available in these seed banks which have been saved from extinction and today a large amount of seeds are available in the bank along with farmers.

Story of Rameshwar Keram

Rameshwar Keram, who lives in village Pondi, has become an inspiration for other farmers, growing vegetables on 3 acres of land using better technology and also taking maize and paddy crops. The family seriously learned new ways from the engagement with the project and carried forward their livelihood. After the production of turmeric, ginger and potato, it was learned to produce seasonal vegetables, but the problem was how to sell in the market, as there was never any work to sell in the market, the project was also trained on this subject and those All the techniques were discussed which is necessary for the market system. Today, both husband and wife are selling their agricultural products in the market together and are able to meet every family's needs, their children are studying and getting better nutrition.

Apart from this, the family has also started creating small resources for their farming, in which pumps for irrigation, farming equipment etc., ever dependent on wages, the family is living a better life today.

Women Leadership

While working with women panchayat representatives, we concluded the 5-year project, worked continuously with women representatives in Baihar development to increase their leadership capacity, it got many better results. The representatives of the women recognized their role and during their tenure, their ward or panchayat did many notable works. Women representatives made a lot of work on nutrition, women safety, employment and health, especially women awareness and awareness of violence against women, women in this area became very aware and recognized their rights. The Women's Representative Organization established its identity in government departments and achieved success by working on issues of social interest.

Activities in 2019-20

Panchayat elections could not be held this year due to various circumstances, but we conducted awareness campaign before the panchayat elections. Under the sweep campaign, information dissemination was conducted in about 25 panchayats of Baihar development block, in addition to this campaign training was conducted for prospective women candidates, new people get the opportunity to lead in panchayat, their dreams of development of panchayat And the program helped to advance thinking. During training, women openly gave their views on how they want to see their village. What are the ways to move forward on how these dreams can be fulfilled, all these topics were discussed a lot.

Adolescent girls were also added to the project this year and their training was also done. In the project, special attention was paid by women representatives to the health and nutrition of children and adolescent girls. On how to avoid malnutrition and how to improve the services of Anganwadi, the women representatives worked a lot and gave their full support.

Collaboration with URJA HELP DESK

The organization participated in the URJA Help Desk, a program run by the Madhya Pradesh Police and conducted awareness activities against female violence in the community, providing necessary support to the department in Balaghat district. In Baihar, JAGRITI MAHILA JAN PRATINIDHI SANGATHAN conducted an awareness campaign with the Police Department in about 10 villages. Apart from this, the women representatives worked continuously in their villages on nutrition and vaccination, supporting Anganwadi workers and Asha to improve their work. Due to their efforts, women representatives organized awareness and health testing camps, in this work the cooperation of Health Department was obtained. The women and child development department supported their DASTAK campaign, 15 women sarpanches went door-to-door during this campaign to see vaccination and nutritional conditions.

SOMVATI become a good leader

Somvati Dhurve Ward no. 7 is the Panch of Ramhepur Panchayat. For the first time in 2015, she came to the panchayat as ward panch. But did not know what to do and how to do the work, Somvati connected with this project of CDC and started attending trainings and meetings. What is his role as a punch learned in trainings, what are his responsibilities. Also, learned how to plan Panchayat, what is the budget, what are the standing committees, what are the powers of Gram Sabha. Somvati also realized that she is a special woman and she has to do some better work. With her learning and encouragement, Somvati did remarkable work in the panchayat. Soaking pits near 06 hand pumps and 2 wells so that there is no dirt and diseases in the village. Teacher in village school did not come on time, Somvati spoke to the teacher and explained that children are upset due to their not coming on time, if you do not come on time, we will complain to you, in



this way the school system Reformed | Attempted to get new Anganwadi buildings for the village and got it approved. With the efforts of Somvati, 2 small ponds and 1 paved road were built in his ward. The wages of 5 people of the ward of Somvati were not paid for 2 years, for this, discussed with the MNREGA coordinator and payment of 6500 was possible. Somvati inspires the women of her village to come to Anganwadi and finds herself full of confidence today.

SWEEP Campaign in BICHHIYA Block of MANDLA district

SWEEP campaign was launched from May 2019 in Bichhiya block of Mandla district in collaboration with The Hunger Project. Work with women was started in 30 panchayats of the block, profiling of panchayats and discussion was organized on organizing women people's representatives and development of panchayat with them. We felt that such works have never been done in this entire region, in which women have an opportunity to come forward and discuss development issues with them. Generally, in this tribal-dominated block, there are a lot of women's issues that need to be worked out, such as the opportunities that women are getting and the way they come forward and put their thoughts and ideas in the community. The development issues are fixed according to the thinking of women, lack of education is clearly visible, at the present time there are plenty of opportunities for girls education and girls are getting education which is a good sign. But apart from this the health and employment opportunities are not much, migration from this area is enough which is a major means of livelihood of the people. During this campaign, all these issues were widely discussed with women and women people's representatives were encouraged to include these issues towards social change. More and more women, especially young women, can come forward and lead in the process of development. .

Toward young leadership

It is often seen that the youth leadership in village panchayat as women panch or sarpanch have very few opportunities, the community's thinking is not very vocal as female leadership. Everyone thinks that in the village or in the ward, they should be led by a very old woman, young women and daughters-in-law rarely get opportunities. There is a need to talk on this topic, because new ideas and new energy will be available only through youth, during this campaign, many young women were discussed and got an opportunity to know their views, one thing came out clearly that the youth They want to lead, but it is not possible due to lack of information and encouragement. Youths were added to the campaign and given opportunities to understand the issues of change in their villages, today there are many development plans which can be changed if implemented in the villages. It is important to have better and sensitive leadership at the village level,

MOR GAON KE ESKUL (MTBMLE)

More work could not be done under the project this year due to Corona, but in the last quarter of 2019, a lot of activities in the project were conducted to empower the community. In the mother tongue-based multilingual education system, the community has a big role, it has been our endeavor to first make the community aware of this, so that the mother tongue can be valued and the process of teaching learning should be strengthened. Under the project, 76 Mata Samiti was formed in Anganwadi, project staff was actively involved in the formation of Village Education Committee. Subsequently, the work of training of these village level committees was started, one day training was organized and how the primary education should be improved and discussed with the committee members, as well as their action plan. The facilities available in the schools located in the village were assessed and how the facilities should be increased. The project was being implemented in collaboration with NEG FIRE New Delhi but due to change in FCRA laws it was not possible to operate the project further after October 2020 and hence the project could not be carried forward.

Awareness and Safety of Children's in COVID-19

Schools were closed due to Covid-19 and it was necessary that the children and the community should be made aware of this and the methods of rescue. Under the project, 3000 children were provided with masks, soaps and sanitizers, posters of awareness were put up in the community and the process of washing hands repeatedly for rescue.

Project EMBED (Elimination of Mosquito Borne Endemic Diseases)

In the third year of the EMBED project operated in collaboration with Family Health India, we are working in 47 villages in three blocks, the project was started from 119 villages. In the last three years, due to increased awareness on malaria in the targeted villages, the community has started using malaria prevention measures, malaria prevention measures, malaria prevention and fever case management have been prominent in the rural community. Any fever can be malaria, an attempt was made to establish this message widely in the community through the project. People are coming forward to get the fever checked Under the project, the chaupal is being organized by the staff continuously, every person of the community is being informed through three awareness modules, organizing the chaupal in small groups has helped to reach each house. The project is getting all possible help from district malaria office and health administration at district and block level. It is a mixed effort of all that malaria cases have come down and if cases have come, then their treatment has become possible.

Awareness activities are being conducted at various levels under the project, reaching far-flung villages through IEC vans for wider awareness, communicating with the community and discussing the role of the community in malaria prevention, the project Community works were promoted in the villages and people were taken along in the cleanliness drive in villages.

Efforts were made to create awareness on the methods of using mosquito nets through small models, today the community has started buying mosquito nets for themselves which shows the success of the project.

Test, Treat, Track

Three things are being worked on prominently in the project, test, treat and track. The community is being made aware in the same way, if there is fever, then do the test, if you have malaria, then complete the treatment and other people in the community should also be tested and track the others that malaria is not spread. In this way, the spread of malaria in the community can be prevented and people's lives can be protected. Two types of posters have been installed in all public places of the project area, Primary Health Center and Anganwadi. A medicine chart was also put up so that service providers also know how to treat and which medicines are to be given, ASHA workers are being trained for this task. ASHA is the worker who has to be tested and treated in the community, so it is very important to be trained ASHA worker. through this there is a lot of potential for change in rural tribal areas.

Fighting with MALARIA

To eliminate malaria, work is being done as per the strategy set in the targeted villages in the project. Asha workers are being planned for their work during the training, the project is not only affected by the target villages but also the surrounding villages have been affected by this and there has been a decrease in malaria cases. Through this project, a population of about 40 to 50 thousand has been reached, different activities have made people aware. Private Health Service Providers providing health services in villages of far flung areas were also trained through the project and they were also encouraged to perform fever tests. Exorcists and traditional healers from villages were also trained on malaria under the project and were advised to get blood tests done in case of fever. School children and youth were made aware of malaria through snake ladder games and interesting activities. Children's participation was also ensured through essay and drawing competition.

CHILDLINE se DOSTI Campaign

The Child Line team successfully conducted the CHILDLINE SE DOSTI campaign from its annual program Child Line in November 2020. Activities with children were organized in different villages of Balaghat, Paraswara and Baihar development blocks, children were made aware of their rights. In case of any problem, children were also trained for how to call 1098. During this time, the community was also made aware that how can children be protected from exploitation in any way that happens to children. The program was also organized in the Bal Grihas situated in Balaghat, besides other staff of ICPS were also included in the program, this program made a successful attempt to connect the youth.

Relief Work during Covid-19 by CHILDLINE

The lock-down caused by Corona has brought daily wage families into trouble. There were many calls in the child line, in which everyone complained that ration was not available with the family. Children are facing difficulties in maintenance. Our team continued to work during this and transported ration kits to the people, 399 families were provided food kits through the child line. In addition to Balaghat, calls were also made for help from Seoni, we also provided assistance for children in Seoni. During this time many calls were received, in which different help was provided. During the outreach, the Child Line team received cases of raped girls who were pregnant and were not receiving any nutritional and health services. Child Line took all these cases seriously and provided nutritional food to the girls. Apart from this, essential health services were also provided.

During this time, the Child Line team distributed masks, soap etc. to the children to avoid corona and explained the methods of hand washing, besides wall writing to protect the corona. A number of misconceptions were spreading on Corona and awareness was also necessary, so the team acted very sensitively and played an important role in protecting children from Corona infection.




Our team is constantly working with these children and is trying to link them with education and other creative activities. This year, we connected these children to theater, as well as training in paper meshi, in order to bring happiness in the lives of these children, the team of the organization is engaged, we are getting the support of many people, enlightened citizens of Balaghat And organizations are coming forward to help in different ways.

Childline out reach

In the year 2019-20, we got more than 1500 calls which were of different works, the child line team is constantly reaching out to the children and helping them. The result of the continuous efforts of the past years is that people are getting to know our work and we are providing services to the children trapped in any kind of trouble. In the last year, 153 cases related to sexual exploitation of children, 119 missing cases, 86 cases in which parents sought help.

Nutrition kit to Pregnant & lactating women during covid-19

In collaboration with Jagori Rural, we provided nutrition kits to 100 pregnant and lactating women, due to covid-19, Anganwadis were not opening due to which nutritious food was not being distributed. Women of Gond and Baiga community living in very poor conditions were not getting any extra nutrition, this nutrition kit was distributed in the villages located far away like Koylikhapa, Dheeri, Jaitpuri, Mohrai, Samaria, Bhalapuri. Health advice along with nutrition kit was also given through meetings, use of nutritious food was also discussed with women

Relief Work during Covid-19 by THP

In collaboration with The Hunger Project New Delhi, 30 panchayats of Baihar development block and provided ration kits to the needy families in Baihar's municipal area, prolonged lock-downs put a lot of families in trouble. Workers, single women, elderly and disabled people were facing a lot of problems. In this difficult period, The Hunger Project provided considerable support and through different 5 rounds, the organization helped in providing relief material to 1387 families. Along with relief material, awareness raising work was also done in collaboration with Hunger Project. During this time, the team of CDC worked hard to reach out to the needy, relief work was done in a very systematic way, first the list of families was made, local panchayats and representatives were included in it. Permission was obtained from the district and block administration, after which ration kits were made and then the relief materials were provided to each family. During the relief material distribution, the guide line of Kovid-19 was completely followed. The community was informed about the use of masks and to maintain sufficient distance, messages were given to stay indoors during lock down and wash hands frequently.

Food Support to old age & differently abled persons by Wipro Fdn.

During and after the lock down, many people contacted us, including the elderly and the disabled, there were many reasons that they were not getting ration. During this pandemic, the Wipro Foundation also provided support to the organization and we provided ration kits to 200 families, especially elderly and single women and differently-abled persons.

We started the relief work in collaboration with PHF, in which the children of the slum of Balaghat were first provided with ration kits. This is a very weak section which had the first effect of lock down, after starting with about 35 children, our relief work continued even after lock down and we collected resources from different places, the institution is grateful to everyone.

Health Check-up for all 200 Street Children's

It is always our endeavour to ensure that the children remain healthy and safe, we started the work of conducting health tests of all children in collaboration with the District Health Department. Every week our team brings some children to the district hospital for health tests where they are examined and necessary medicines are also given. Teenager girls are being trained on their health and body changes, so that they do not have any problem during menstruation. In this effort, a group of women have also been joined, including doctors, teenager girls are being trained from doctors. Children of slum area of Baihar are also being given nutrition and health education on a daily basis.

Project : Keep Smiling (Street Connected Children's)

We are working with over 200 Street Connected Children in the project "Smile Keep", supported by the Consortium for Street Children's UK. There is a need to protect these children from corona infection and keep them healthy. Under the project, nutrition is being provided to these children for 6 months. Also to avoid corona, necessary materials like masks, soaps and sanitizers are constantly being provided. In the project, these children are being connected with creative work, the child line project team is working with these children by keeping them in touch. Children are being made aware on different topics such as what and who are child rights, what is child abuse, how to identify good touch and bad touch. What are the signs that should be kept in mind? These children have a lot of abilities and energy, it is necessary to put these abilities in positive and constructive work. We have been working to connect these children to different fields like some children have been associated with acting and have the opportunity to play, some children have been given skill training and they have been taught to make beautiful articles from waste paper and clay. This year celebrated Diwali with these children and new hot clothes were also given to the children





Livelihood support from PHF to rural women

In the Corona era, many families faced livelihood crisis, mainly daily wage families, single mothers, widows and women from minority communities were supported to start livelihood activity with the help of PHF. Till the present time, we have provided assistance for small IGP to about 115 women, women are being able to take care of their families and their lives with these small jobs. Small employment at village level like grocery store, tea snack shop, fish shop, egg shop etc. 10 women of village Nunkatola were given beekeeping training and 50 boxes were also provided for honey bee keeping, women are getting daily income from almost all employment and they are working hard to advance their employment. Due to the lock-down caused by Corona, the people's capital was almost exhausted and the means of employment were also reduced, with this cooperation, efforts are being made to enable those vulnerable families, today tribal women are also better in small shops. The CDC staff is constantly encouraging all the women.

Cloths for Children's (Street Connected)

This year, we have started a Cloth for Children program for weak economic conditions, slum and street connected children. It is often seen that there are many children who do not have clothes even for minimum needs, children are spending their childhood wearing dirty and torn old clothes. We requested people for help and the children in our house have become old, become small and give us such clothes which are not in use. We will take these clothes to those children. Many people came with us in this campaign and collected clothes and brought them to us. This year we collected more than 485 clothes and made them available to children. This campaign was started by Mrs. Clara Carlo. Balaghat I.G. Mr. Rao supported warm clothes for 50 children, as well as young businessman of the city Mr. Atul Vaidya provided warm clothes to 40 children, Mr. Sachin Rajput and his friends supported shoes and slippers for 100 children, Mr. & Mrs. Marko supported nutrition for girls. The CDC family extends thanks to all of your colleagues, and your support is expected in the future as well. Despite all the development plans and programs, there are many children who need a lot of support and compassion, a large number of children who live in very high risk, or children are in different types of risk. It is our small effort in which we can provide better opportunities to children.

- There is need to construct training and office at Garhi. Land is available with near by School building, Two training hall, library and office is require to construct for better delivery of program, also staff rooms need to be develop in Garhi.
